I was asked to write this month's article for the Niblick newsletter as the Club Champion, to introduce myself and maybe to share a little bit of my history and some golf tips. So, if any of that is interesting to you, please keep reading. My name is Anthony Benenati. I joined the SSGC a couple of years ago in hopes of meeting new friends and playing some competitive golf again. I did play for a year in the Sepulveda Men's Club, and won a few tournaments, but I wasn't meeting any guys that I related to. Maybe that's what happens as we get older, or maybe it is just the people I played with. Either way, I needed a change. I remember playing with Jan in my first tournament in the club and instantly bonded with him over our military service (I served in the Air Force from 1986-1992; the last year during Gulf War 1) and our love for the game. He was warm and welcoming, and I immediately knew I had made the right choice by joining this club.


I started golfing in San Clemente when I was about 14 or 15 after moving from Boston. I still remember my first set of Spaulding Executive golf clubs with my persimmon woods. Those were the days of "hitting them on the screws" since there were screws holding in the face plate. I played every day I could after school until dark. I read all the books and practiced what they taught almost every day. My first tournament was the San Diego Juniors in 1983. I played throughout the military and after, but I would say that I started to take my game seriously about 20 years ago. Up until that point I had never had an official lesson. I am completely self-taught. Some trivia about me is that I don't wear a glove. I learned that way, so it is what feels right. I have never had a hole-in-one. Some find it hard to believe, including myself, but I have come to learn that in many cases they are pure luck. I have seen a guy get one after hitting a tree. I once took a lesson from Roger Dunn before he passed, but at that time he was more interested in showing me his scrapbook about himself. But I digress.

Professionally, I am a yoga and philosophy teacher. It has been my career for over 30 years. When I mention yoga, most people have an idea of what it is, but don't know much about it. For the sake of this article, I will just say that it is one of the most important parts of my life and, therefore, my game. Yoga isn't about being flexible. That is one of the great myths. It is surely a byproduct, but it is not the goal. Yoga keeps me strong in a longer range of motion than just weightlifting or other physical modalities. It keeps me balanced. It helps to keep me centered and focused by breathing and getting into an easeful place in my mind. One interesting fact about yoga is that, originally, it was practiced only by men. I would say nothing has had a bigger impact on my game than yoga. It's like golf and yoga were made for each other. They are a perfect complement.

As for tips, I am sure you have heard them all. However, practice is the key. And I don't mean just beating a bucket of balls. I mean practice like you're playing a match. The adage, "practice makes perfect" is baloney. You could be practicing the wrong thing over and over and just creating bad habits. Gary Player said, "practice makes permanent". How you practice is more important than your practice. I realize that this is a senior's club and none of us are getting any younger, so practice the things that are going to improve your scores, mainly the short game. 100 yards and in are where most golfers lose most of their shots, including myself. I can still bomb my drives, but that isn't going to last forever. I rely heavily on my short game and always have. That's where you should spend most of your time. It isn't sexy like driving the ball far, but it will drop your scores, and in turn, give you more joy on the course.
